Choosing appropriate courses for your future pathway is vital. Discuss your choices with parents, your guidance counsellor and teachers. Inappropriate course selections are not easily corrected once the school year is under way.

NUMBER OF COURSES REQUIRED PER GRADE:

The number of courses required for Grade 9 and for Grade 10 is **EIGHT**. Students in Grades 11 and 12 must take a minimum of **SIX** courses.

Students are required to maintain full time status (3 courses per semester) throughout the school year.
